BULLETIN CONNECTION

Today's second reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians contains an early Christian profession of faith: Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; he was buried; he was raised on the third day; he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. This ancient statement of belief reflects the origins of our faith in the death and resurrection of Christ.

With Lent just around the corner, there will be men and women preparing ever more intensely for the sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. These catechumens will make this early Christian proclamation of faith their own at the Easter vigil when they profess their baptismal promises just before they are baptized. We may want to get ourselves ready for Lent by considering what our own faith means to us, acknowledging that Christ died for our sins, and rose that we might have life.

RESULTS OF THE PARISH SURVEY

The Parish Leadership Team met on January 9th with Stephen Gianotti from the Woodland Group, commissioned and funded by the diocese, as facilitator. The purpose of the meeting was to review the results of the Parish Survey and discern a path forward. We were pleased with the percentage of people who replied to the survey during the busy holiday season. It was felt that the survey information was a good sampling and reflected an accurate picture of where we are as a Parish and where we would like to be. Many positive elements were highlighted in the survey. Most people found the churches to be welcoming and caring communities and most are happy with music, liturgy and their worship environment. They were satisfied with the progress we are making with Faith Formation and were pleased in particular with the retreat and mission programs. They praised the work of our active men's and ladies' groups. Almost universally parishioners felt very fortunate to have our current clergy as shepherds of our community.

Areas of need were also highlighted and taken to heart by the committee. We categorized them in the following areas: outreach, communication, the facilities, service ministry, social, priests and staff, finances, music, faith formation and our relationship to the Universal Church. The list was broken down into an Action Plan. A few of these items of the Action Plan were referred to the Liturgy and Finance Commissions for implementation. The retreats and special speakers were left to the Parish Council for consideration. Individual members of the team took responsibility for the leadership on the remaining items.

The team divided the Action Plan into three time frames. Some were considered doable immediately while others would take further study over the next few months. A short list of concerns was more complicated and would require a longer period of study. The survey projected the Parish's future as a place of faith and worship based on an inter-generational sense of community with lots of young people involved. We would be in a consolidated set of

buildings that is affordable with clergy and staff to meet our needs.

Again, we would like to thank you for your thoughtful and prayerful responses. You can look forward to more information as the Action Plan unfolds.
