Fr. Eddy is supposed to be back in the Boston area soon to seek further medical treatment. He also hopes to continue his relief mission. I've invited him to come to Bristol June 12-13 to make a personal appeal. His story is a touching one, a testimony to faith, resilience, and hope that we would want to hear.

Let's continue praying for our suffering sisters and brothers in Haiti and not forget the "little ones in need."
