Jean Paul Downs and Emma Giesing will be united in Holy Matrimony June 26, 2010.



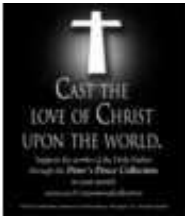

BULLETIN CONNECTION

In writing to the Galatians Paul describes how we are children of God through our faith in Christ. Our baptism unites us to Christ making us heirs to the promise of eternal life. What is often left unsaid, but made explicit in this week's Gospel, is that life in Christ also has its demands. The cross does not belong to Jesus alone. By being baptized into Christ we share in the cross as well as the resurrection. Each day the followers of Christ are called to take up the cross, denying themselves in the process. This is how we will find our life.



Ordinary Time

We are now a few weeks into Ordinary Time - our longest liturgical season. Ordinary time gives us the opportunity to follow the public life of the Lord and to meditate on the mysteries and miracles of Jesus and our faith.

Ordinary time is divided into two parts: the Monday after the Baptism of the Lord to Ash Wednesday, and the season we're in now, from the Monday after Pentecost to the first Sunday of Advent.

The vestments are green, except for feasts and solemnities. Liturgically, the color green represents life, growth and hope.
