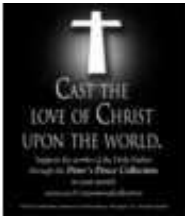


THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

BULLETIN CONNECTION
Today's Gospel selection clearly presents the construct that Luke will use in his evangelical writing. Luke portrays Jesus on a journey to Jerusalem. His ministry takes him ever closer to the Holy City in which he will accomplish his Father's will. In the weeks to come, we should not lose sight of this Lucan literary device. The Temple is located in Jerusalem, but Jesus is the new temple. Jerusalem is the holy city for the Jews, but in the prophets (especially Isaiah) it is also the place to which the Gentiles stream for salvation. And it is from there that the disciples will go out to spread the good news.



Incense, Candles and Flowers at our liturgies are an historical bridge, connecting us in an awesome and beautiful way to the worship of the early Church.

The offering of incense with its fragrant smoke wafting upward, is symbolically carrying our prayers and worship with it.

The 8th chapter of Revelation says "An angel came and stood at the altar, holding a gold censer. He was given a great quantity of incense to offer, along with the prayers of all the holy ones, on the gold altar that was before the throne. The smoke of the incense along with the prayers of the holy ones went up before God from the hand of the angel."

Although the use of incense is optional, as one of the lasting traditions of the Church, we regularly incense the cross, altar, sacred books and vessels and even the priest and other liturgical ministers, as well as the assembly.
