BULLETIN CONNECTION

Happy Fourth of July! Independence Day is a great national holiday in which Americans reaffirm their patriotism and celebrate the gifts of freedom and equality that are enunciated in the *Declaration of Independence*. But as Christians, we have a deeper and more fundamental citizenship that we cannot lose sight of. As Paul tells the Philippians, "Our citizenship is in heaven" (3:20). While days like today may want to pull us down the path of what is often called American exceptionalism, our Christian faith demands that we acknowledge a larger reality. God favors no one, and cares for all. As disciples of Christ we must do the same.

INDEPENDENCE DAY

We can find no more appropriate thought for Independence Day than the famous poem by Emma Lazarus which is engraved on a tablet within the pedestal on which the Statue of Liberty stands.

The New Colossus

Not like the brazen giant of Greek fame,
With conquering limbs astride from land to land;
Here at our sea-washed, sunset gates shall stand
A mighty woman with a torch, whose flame
Is the imprisoned lightning, and her name
Mother of Exiles. From her beacon-hand
Glows world-wide welcome; her mild eyes command
The air-bridged harbor that twin cities frame.
"Keep ancient lands, your storied pomp!" cries she
With silent lips. "Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me,

Candles and Flowers



In our liturgies, candlelight takes on a symbolic value. At the Easter Vigil, the Light of Christ enters a darkened Church, symbolizing new life and hope for us all as the light spreads from

candle to candle, finally illuminating the entire worship space. At Baptism we receive a candle symbolizing this same Light of Christ.

We light at least two candles at Mass and on great feast days the sanctuary is brightly lit with many candles. A single candle marks the presence of the Lord in the Sanctuary each day of the year except Holy Saturday.

With the exception of the penitential season of Lent, flowers beautify our worship spaces throughout the liturgical year. Although not required for our liturgies, flowers and greens placed near the altar and ambo bring the beauty of God's creation into the house of the Lord.
