How does being anxious and worried affect your faith life?

**BULLETIN CONNECTION**

Shared responsibility is a watchword in political circles for those who want to foster a less dependent entitlement structure in response to fewer resources being available. But the concept of shared responsibility finds no welcome among politicians of any stripe when it comes to playing the blame game and painting their opponents as the ones responsible for failure. Martha could have benefited from a little shared responsibility although it doesn't seem that she is going to get it. Playing the blame game won't help her either, and maybe that is the lesson for us: God gives us a job to do, and it is ours to accomplish.

**THE NORTH AMERICAN MARTYRS' STORY**

We live in an area where there are many Catholics and most people claim to be Christians. We forget that this was not always the case. In the early 1600's when Europeans first settled the Americas, they encountered the Native Americans who were not Christians but who practiced native religions. A group of priests and lay volunteers in France could not wait to bring Christianity to Canada and the Northeastern United States.

Isaac Joaues, Jean de Brebeuf, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, Noel Chabannel, Rene Goupil, and Jean Lalande, might not be household names, but maybe they should be. These are the North American Martyrs who died in Canada and New York at the hands of the Iroquois who were the mortal enemies of the tribes the missionaries ministered to. From around 1626 - 1646, these eight and a number of other missionaries endured extreme deprivation all in the name of saving these peoples and of bringing them to a knowledge of Jesus. The martyrdom of these Jesuits and that of some of their Indian converts, in many cases, was slow and painful. Yet they rejoiced in the chance to give their lives for Christ and to gain merits for the salvation of the native population. Might we burn with a similar zeal for the Gospel of Christ.
